Tract No. BCV-AR-19. U. S. Department of the Interior Bonneville Power Administration. Access Road Easement.

For and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five Dollars (\$25.00) in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we, Robert C. Prindle and Louise A. Prindle, husband and wife, now and at the time of acquiring title, have granted, bargained, and sold and by these presents do hereby grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the United States of America and its assigns, a permanent easement and right-of-way approximately 14 feet in width, with such additional widths as are necessary to provide for cuts, fills, and turnouts and for curves at the angle points, all over and across the lands of the undersigned in

All that portion of the SW¼ of the SW¼ which lies east and north of a certain creek running through same and usually known as Dry Creek, in Section 1, Township 1 North, Range 5 East, W. M., situate in the County of Skamania, State of Washington;

for the following purposes, namely: the right to enter and to clear of timber, endangering trees, and brush; to grade, level, cut, fill, drain, build, maintain, repair, and rebuild a road or highway and such culverts, bridges, turnouts, retaining walls, or other appurtenant structures as may be necessary, on, over, and across the land embraced within the right-of-way, the center line of which is described as follows:

Beginning at survey station 535+51.59, a point on the survey line of the Bonneville Power Administration's Bonneville-Camas-Vancouver transmission line in the SW¼ of the SW¼ of Section 1, Township 1 North, Range 5 East of the Willamette Meridian, said point being 870.9 feet north and 353.4 feet east of the southwest corner of said Section 1; thence S. 35° 21' W. 142.6 feet; thence S. 89° 35' E. 211.8 feet; thence S. 20° 01' E. 89.8 feet; thence S. 29° 31' E. 121.3 feet; thence S. 70° 03' E. 219.3 feet; thence N. 55° 18' E. 315.9 feet; thence S. 69° 29' E. 105.7 feet; thence S. 38° 27' E. 110.9 feet; thence S. 35° 25' W. 151.9 feet; thence S. 2° 01' E. 217.2 feet to a point in the existing access road in the SW¼ of the SW¼ of said Section 1, said point being 203.4 feet north and 1126.5 feet east of the southwest corner of said Section 1; subject to the easement heretofore acquired by the United States of America for its Bonneville-Camas-Vancouver transmission line right-of-way.

It is understood and agreed that the United States of America, its agents or assigns, shall have the right to appropriate from any lands of the undersigned, such timberand rock as may be necessary for the construction and repair of said road.

It is understood and agreed that the United States of America, its agents or assigns, shall not have the exclusive use of said road, but that existing rights therein shall remain and be recognized.
