

A-13 Item 11: The right granted by order of the Commissioner of Public Lands dated January 25, 1952, to overflow and perpetually back and hold water upon and over the following described land:

That portion of the south half of the northeast quarter of Section 29, Township 6 North, Range 4 East of Willamette Meridian, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the east line of said Section which is 1,070 feet north of the east quarter section corner thereof, thence south $37^{\circ} 30'$ west 830 feet and south $63^{\circ} 12'$ west 913 feet to the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter, thence west along the south line of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter 500 feet, thence north $20^{\circ} 45'$ east 1406 feet to the northeast corner of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter, thence east 1320 feet to the northeast corner of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter and thence south 250 feet along the east line of Section 29 to the point of beginning, containing an area of 35.1 acres.

A-13 Item 12: That certain license issued to Pacific Power & Light Company by the Federal Power Commission under date of April 25, 1951, for said Yale Hydroelectric Project on the Lewis River in said counties of Clark and Cowlitz, State of Washington, designated "Project No. 2071, Washington" in the records of said commission and all rights and interests and all obligations of the Company in, under or by virtue of said license.

A-14—Lebanon Hydroelectric Generating Plant

The hydroelectric generating plant, known as the Lebanon plant, located in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, State of Oregon, and located on the land described under G-7, Item 7 of this Article.

A-15—Albany Hydroelectric Generating Plant

The hydroelectric generating plant, known as the Albany plant, located in the City of Albany, Linn County, State of Oregon, and located on the land described under G-6, Item 8, of this Article.

A-16—Stayton Hydroelectric Generating Plant

The hydroelectric generating plant known as the Stayton plant, located in the City of Stayton, Marion County, State of Oregon, including the following described land:
