U. S. Department of the Interior Bonneville Power Administration. Tract No. BCV-AR-1 Parcel #1. Access Road Easement.

For and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we, Robert C. Prindle and Louise A. Prindle, husband and wife now and at the time of acquiring title, have granted, bargained, and sold and by these presents do hereby grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the United States of America and its assigns, a permanent easement and right-of-way approximately 14 feet in width, with such additional widths as are necessary to provide for cuts, fills, and turnouts and for curves at the angle points, all over and across the lands of the undersigned in the South half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 2; the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 11; the South half of the Southwest Quarter, and the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 1; all in Yownship 1 North, Range 5 East of the Willamette Meridian, situate in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, for the following purposes, namely: the right to enter and to clear of timber, endangering trees, and brush; to grade; level, cut, fill, drain, build, maintain, repair, and rebuild a road or highway and such Sulverts, bridges, turnouts, retaining walls, or other appurtenant structures as may be necessary, on, over, and across the land embraced within the right-of-way, the center line of which is described as follows:
