WITNESSETH:

That Citizens State Bank has this lay sold and delivered, and does by these presents sell and deliver unto J. W. Bethea, the following described personal property to-wit: One Gas Logging Donkey with lines, blocks and all equipment thereto attached, which Donkey is

now located near skamunia, beamunia County, Washington. For this consideration the buyer agrees to pay unto the seller at the Citizens state Bank, Camas, Washington the sum of Eight Hundred Thirty and no/LOO (\$450.00) Dollars in the following manner: One Hundred Dollars at the time of the execution of this contract, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and the balance to be paid as follows: One Hundred Dollars shall be paid on February 15, 1940; One Aundred Dollars shall be paid when weather conditions permit logging, and the balance thereof shall be paid \$100 per month, payable on the 15th of each month, thereafter until the balance is paid.
