

ROBERT. F. BROWN ET AL TO THE PUBLIC
ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF SKAMANIA MINING COMPANY

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT AND OF ASSOCIATION, MADE AND ENTERED INTO THIS 28TH DAY OF JUNE, 1924, BY AND BETWEEN ROBERT F. BROWN, THOMAS S. MCGLOTHLEN, CHARLES O. NELSON AND DELOS SPAULDING (ALL OF CENTRALIA, LEWIS COUNTY, WASHINGTON), AND JOHN ARTHUR (OF SEATTLE, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON), ALL BEING CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES AND OVER THE AGE OF TWENTY-ONE YEARS, WITNESSETH:

THAT UNDER THE LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES THE THREE FIRST NAMED PARTIES HAVE LOCATED AND DULY FILED MINERAL CLAIMS UPON TEN CERTAIN CONTIGUOUS^{MINING} CLAIMS SITUATED IN NIGGERHEAD MINING DISTRICT, ADJACENT TO CAMP CREEK, A TRIBUTARY OF MCCOY CREEK, IN SKAMANIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON, RESPECTIVELY NAMED AND KNOWN AS LA RICA, LA RICA EXTENSION, LA RICA EXTENSION No. 2, LA RICA EXTENSION No. 3, LA RICA EXTENSION No. 4, LA RICA EXTENSION No. 5, LENORA, LANORE EXTENSION LANORE EXTENSION No. 2, LA RICA PLACER MINING CLAIM, TOGETHER WITH A ONE-HALF INTEREST IN THE WATER OF SAID CAMP CREEK, AS DESCRIBED IN BOOK 3 OF WATER PERMITS, AT PAGE 393, BEING KNOWN AS WATER PERMIT No. 393 IN THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERVISOR OF HYDRAULICS AT OLYMPIA, WASHINGTON;

THAT THE OWNERSHIP OF THE RESPECTIVE INTERESTS IN SAID PROPERTIES, RIGHTS AND CLAIMS STANDS AND IS AS FOLLOWS, TO-WIT: ROBERT F. BROWN, A ONE-FOURTH INTEREST; THOMAS S. MCGLOTHLEN, A ONE-FOURTH INTEREST; CHARLES O. NELSON, A ONE-FOURTH INTEREST; AND DELOS SPAULDING AND JOHN ARTHUR, JOINTLY BETWEEN THEM, A ONE-FOURTH INTEREST, WHICH SAID LAST NAMED INTEREST ARISES NOT FROM LOCATION RIGHTS, BUT IS INCIDENTAL TO THE PRINCIPAL OWNERSHIP IN THE THREE PERSONS FIRST NAMED AND ARISES IN RECOGNITION OF LEGAL SERVICES RENDERED AND TO BE RENDERED BY THEM TO SAID PRINCIPALS, AND THEREBY NOT AFFECTED BY SUCH OBLIGATIONS AS MIGHT BE MUTUALLY ASSUMED AND BORNE BY THE PRINCIPALS.

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS ASSOCIATION IS FORMED FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERFECTING THE TITLE TO SAID CLAIMS AND PROPERTIES; OF WORKING AND DEVELOPING THEM IN A MINER-LIKE MANNER; AND OF ESTABLISHING AN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF PROCEEDURE AND OF BUSINESS MANAGEMENT CALCULATED TO INSURE ECONOMY AND EFFICIENCY. THE OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE A PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, A SECRETARY AND A TREASURER. THE OFFICES OF SECRETARY AND TREASURER MAY BE HELD BY THE SAME PERSON. SAID OFFICERS SHALL CONSTITUTE THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE ASSOCIATION; THEY SHALL HAVE POWER TO TRANSACT AND CARRY ON ALL ITS BUSINESS, AND TO APPOINT ALL NEEDED ASSISTANTS AND REMOVE THEM AT WILL.
