

MESA COUNTY

(Grand Junction Radio Tower Station Site): Decision dated July 30, 1956, from the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, Land Office, Denver, Colorado, approving right of way for radio tower station site in Mesa County, Colorado, being a tract of land out of the property of the United States of America, in a portion of S. 25, T. 11 S., R. 102 W., 6th Principal Meridian, Mesa County, Colorado, being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the SW corner of Section 36, T-11-S, R-102-W; thence, N 6° 40' 45" E, at 5325 feet, more or less, cross the north line of said Section 36, continuing for a total distance of 6399.15 feet to the center of the base of the C.A.A. Beacon Tower; thence, N 45° 15' 15" W, 34.85 feet to the SW corner of the herein-described tract of land for the true point of beginning; thence, N 89° 49' 15" E, 100 feet to a point; thence, N 0° 10' 45" W, 100 feet to a point; thence, N 89° 49' 15" W, 100 feet to a point; thence, S 0° 10' 45" E, 100 feet to the point of beginning. The herein-described tract of land to contain 0.23 acres of land, more or less.
