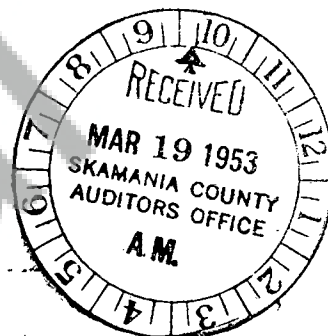


EASEMENT DEED - INDIVIDUAL

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that GEORGE ALWAY AND WINIFRED ALWAY and Norris W. Esch and Elma Esch, hereinafter called the "Grantor", do hereby grant and convey to the United States of America, acting by and through the Forest Service, U.S.D.A., and assigns, hereinafter called the "Government", an easement and right-of-way, including the right, privilege and authority to locate, construct, maintain, patrol and repair a roadway and electric and telephone transmission lines over, and pipelines upon, along and across the following-described real property situated in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, to wit:

A strip of land 66 feet in width traversing the following-described real property:

$N\frac{1}{2}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 5, T3N, R8EWM



The said strip being 33 feet in width on each side of a center line of a road as located and to be constructed on the ground, with as much additional width as required for adequate protection of cuts and fills, said center line being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the South line of the $N\frac{1}{2}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ 174 feet westerly from the SE corner of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$, thence $N35^{\circ}-00'E$ a distance of 202 feet, thence $N49^{\circ}-09'E$ a distance of 77 feet to a point on the East line of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ 219 feet northerly of the SE corner of the $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$, thence continuing $N49^{\circ}-09'E$ a distance of 159 feet, thence $N54^{\circ}-06'E$ a distance of 186 feet, thence $N39^{\circ}-19'E$ a distance of 101 feet, thence $N43^{\circ}-44'E$ a distance of 178 feet, thence $N27^{\circ}-43'E$ a distance of 80 feet, thence $N21^{\circ}-15'E$ a distance of 203 feet, thence $N50^{\circ}-34'E$ a distance of 139 feet, thence $N38^{\circ}-12'E$ a distance of 176 feet, thence $N3^{\circ}-04'E$ a distance of 12 feet to a point on the north line of the parcel (E-W quarter section line) 520 feet westerly of the quarter corner between sections 4 and 5, and containing 2.09 acres more or less.

(Bearings are referred to the South line of the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of the Section which has bearing $N90^{\circ}-00'E$)

Together with reasonable rights of ingress, egress and regress to and from said lands for the purposes designated.

The rights, privileges and authorities herein granted are for full use and enjoyment by the Government for any and all purposes deemed necessary or desirable in connection with the control, management and administration of the national forest, or the resources thereof, and, insofar as compatible therewith, use by the general public and the rights, privileges and authorities herein granted shall continue as long as used for the purposes granted but if for a period of 5 years the Government shall cease to use the rights, privileges and authorities for the purposes granted or shall abandon the use of the easement herein granted then, in any such events, the Grantor may terminate this easement and all rights hereunder shall revert to the holder of the fee title to the lands.

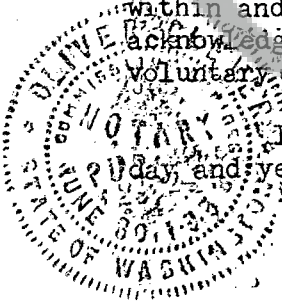
