

Sublette County, Wyoming, being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at the NW corner of the herein described tract of land, from which the NW corner of said Section 12 (2" I.P. W/Brass Cap), T. 28 N., R. 114 W., 6th Principal Meridian, Sublette County, Wyoming, bears N 67° 21' 40" W—1829.02 feet;

Thence, N 0° 24' W—50.00 feet to the point of beginning and containing 0.09 acres of land.

HOGSBACK RADIO TOWER SITE: Decision dated September 16, 1959, from David D. Morgan, Chief Lands Adjudication Unit, U. S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, Cheyenne, Wyoming, granting permission to construct the Hogsback Radio Tower located on public land in Sublette County, Wyoming, being a tract of land out of Section 18, T. 27 N., R. 113 W., Sixth Principal Meridian, Sublette County, Wyoming, being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at an I.P. set for the SE corner of the herein described tract of land, from which the S $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of said Section 18, T. 27 N., R. 113 W., of the 6th Principal Meridian bears S 19° 49' 30" E—2386.84 feet, and U.S.C. & G.S. "Tulsa" bears N 12° 59' W—122.10 feet:

Thence, N 84° 14' W—289.00 feet to an I.P. set for a corner;

Thence, N 5° 46' E—400.00 feet to an I.P. set for a corner;

Thence, S 84° 14' E—165.00 feet to an I.P. set for a corner;

Thence, S 11° 27' 20" E—418.78 feet to the point of beginning.
