WHEREAS, Georgia-Pacific Plywood Company, a Georgia corporation, and Inman-Poulsen Lumber Corporation, an Oregon corporation, are the owners of all the issued and outstanding capital stock of Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company, an Oregon corporation, and

WHEREAS, it is not economical for Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company to continue to produce lumber and by-products, including pulp chips, and

WHEREAS, Georgia-Pacific Plywood Company and Inman-Poulsen Lumber Corporation acquired all the issued and outstanding capital stock of Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company solely for the purpose of acquiring the assets of Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company, and have directed and consented in writing to the dissolution of Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company, and

WHEREAS, on July 8, 1954, Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company delivered duplicate originals of its statement of intent to dissolve to the Corporation Commissioner of the State of Oregon, and on said date the Corporation Commissioner of the State of Oregon filed said duplicate originals of said statement of intent to dissolve under the provisions of Section 57.541, Oregon Revised Statutes, and

WHEREAS, all the obligations of Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company have been paid or adequately provided for, and, under a plan of liquidation of Inman-Poulsen Lumber Company, Inman-Poulsen Lumber Corporation is entitled to distribution of the timber hereinafter described,

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that said INMAN-POULSEN LUMBER COMPANY does hereby grant, bargain,

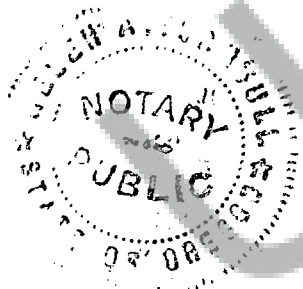
