ARTICLE I.

WHEREAS, the parties hereto, being one of Plaintiff, D., [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are an agreement of lease covering an acreage total of land consisting approximately 1.3 acres [REDACTED] upon the property portion of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of way to the southwest corner of Section 25, Township 2 North, Range 1 East, of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of [REDACTED], County, California, for the purpose of mining for gold, silver and other mineral material.

WHEREAS, by [REDACTED] extension of [REDACTED] dated September 10, 1958, the agreement of lease was extended for an additional five year period commencing September 1, 1959; and the parties hereto desire to extend said lease for a further period.


NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises herein contained the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Said agreement of lease dated September 10, 1958 shall be and is hereby extended for a 5-year period commencing September 1, 1959 to and including August 31, 1964; subject to ninety day written notice of cancellation by either party.
2. As rental for said extended lease, during the lease period to pay to the lessor [REDACTED] the sum of FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00), payable in advance, for the full term of this extension agreement.
3. Except as hereby provided, all of the terms and conditions contained in said lease agreement of September 10, 1958 shall remain unchanged.
