ORDER September 16, 1959

that Application No. 2425 was filed in this office by the United States of America, Gifford Pinchot National Forest, for a right of way for a road over SWE of SWE of Section 27. Township 4 North, Range 9 East, W.M., in Skamania County; that said application was filed in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 145, Session Laws of 1945, providing for the granting of rights of ways to the United States Government over state lands; and

It further appointing that a right of way 45 feet in width is desired; that there are no improvements or merchantable timber on the right of way; that no good reason exists why this right of way should not be granted; and the commissioner being fully edulated, it is therefore

ORDERED and DETERMINED that the plat showing the survey of said right of way as filed with said Application No. 2425 be and the same is hereby approved as the official plat of said road; that an easement be and the same is hereby granted to the United States of America for a road over the following described lands:

That portion of the SWA of SWA of Section 27, Township & North, Range 9 East, W.M., Included within the limits of the following tract:

Deginning at the southwest corner of said Section 27 and running thence S 89° 54' £ 62.9 feet, along the south line of said Section 27, thence N 30° 21' W 124.7 feet to the west line of said Section 27, and thence S 0° 03' £ 97.2 feet to the southwest corner of said Section 27, and point of beginning having an area of 0.14 acre as shown on the plat thereof on file in the office of the Commissioner of Public Lands at Olympia, Washington.

Subject, however, to the following provisions:

1. TERMINATION:

The rights, privileges and authorities herein granted shall continue for as long as used for the purposes granted, but if the grantee shall cease for a period of two years to use the rights, privileges

and authorities for the purposes granted or shall abandon the use of the ossement herein granted, then the State may terminate this easement and all rights hereunder shall revert to the State of Washington

2. DAMAGE:

The granton shell require, as a condition of each agreement with any of its contractors involved in clearing of said right of way or the use of said road, that said contractors take all reasonable precautions to protect adjacent state land, timber and reproduction. Damage to treas and/or reproduction, not included in the original grant, shell be apprecised by the state. Said contractor or contractors shell be billed for these damages at the apprecised rate, except double or triple damages may be charged in the event damages results from negligible acts of said contractors.

3. RESERVATIONS:

The State of Washington reserves to itself the right to use without cost except for its share of read maintenance all partiess of this read system controlled by the grantee to remove state timber and to maintain, patrol, reconstruct and repair said readway for any and all purposes deemed necessary or desirable in connection with the control, management, harvest and administration of state owned lands or the resources thereof, in such manner as will not unreasonably interfere with the use of said read by the grantee or its authorized users or cause substantial injury thereto; Provided, that during parlods when the State of Washington or its assigns uses said read, it will perform its share of read maintenance on the portion so used or shall contribute to the cost of maintenance, so that its proportionate share of the cost of maintening the read to the extent necessary to restore the read to the condition existing at the start of the use will be paid or performed.

The rights, privileges and authorities herein granted ore for full use and enjoyment of the grantee for any and all purposes deemed a necessary or desirable in connection with the control, management and administration of the national ferests or the resources thereof and, inscrar as compatible therewith, the grantee may extend such rights and privileges to others, provided such use by others shall be controlled so it will not, in the opinion of the Regional Forester, interfere unduly with the use of the road by the State of Mashington.
