CERTIFICATE OF ABANDONMENT

On March 20, 1939, C. V. Brown executed an easement in favor of the Secretary of Agriculture of the United States Department of Agriculture, which easement was recorded on March 21, 1939, in Book 27, page 351, records of Skamania County, Washington.

The said easement provides that it is "for any and all purposes ... in connection with the control, administration, or use of the national forests or the resources thereof."

The easement provides that it shall be effective only so long as used for the purposes specified, but that all rights therein shall revert to the owner of the fee as soon as said use thereof shall be abandoned and discontinued.

The easement is of no present or reasonably foreseeable future use to the Forest Service and the use thereof has been discontinued.

An appraisal of the easement indicates that it has no market value and is of no value to the Forest Service. Under the circumstances it would seem to be an unreasonable burden on the Forest Service to retain said easement on inventory and said easement is hereby declared abandoned by the Forest Service.
