

## DEED OF CONVEYANCE

GEORGIA-PACIFIC CORPORATION, a Georgia corporation (Grantor) does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and assign to EMANUEL LUTHERAN CHARITY BOARD, an Oregon non-profit corporation (Grantee) and its successors and assigns the entire and complete interest of Grantor reserved to it as a timber Production Payment in respect of an undivided ninety-five percent (95%) interest in the merchantable timber on the real property in Columbia and Clatsop Counties in the State of Oregon and Cowlitz, Pacific, Skamania and Wahkiakum Counties in the State of Washington, described in that certain "Conveyance and Agreement" dated January 15, 1968, by and between Grantor and Crown Zellerbach Corporation, together with all rights, powers and privileges therein reserved by or granted to the Grantor.

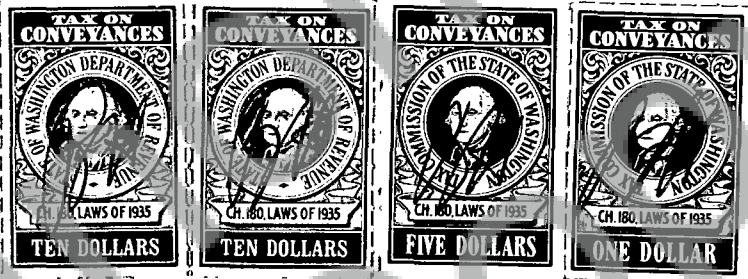
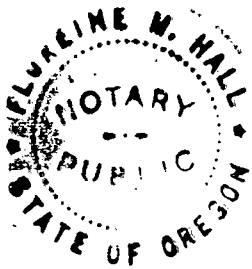
