Mishop DLC No. 39 in secs. 20 and 21, T. 2 N., R. 7 E., of the W.M., with the meander line on the north bank of the Columbia River; thence along the southwesterly limit of the B. B. Bir'op DIC 969.91 feet to the intersection of said limit with the southerly line of that certain tract of land described in Parcel "A" i that certain deed from Frank M. Warren and wife, George A. Warren, Anna Grace Monro and husband, and Frances W. Holt and husband, to the USA, recorded on June 13, 1934, in Book "X" at Page 535 of the deed records of Skamania County, Washington; thence N. 61° 10' E., 702.79 feet following the southerly line of said tract so conveyed to the USA to a point where said southerly line of such tract is intersected by a line drawn parallel to said southwesterly limit of said B.
