NOTICE OF LIEN.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Bud Adams, of Skamania County, State of Washington claims a lien upon a quantity of lumber, railroad ties and timbers located and being upon the platform at Dopp's Spur about 3/4 of a mile East of the Post Office at Skamania, Skamania County, Washington, on the S.P. & S. Railway amounting to about 30,000 feet, also approximately 739 fir railroad ties now contained in a certain car belonging to the Union Pacific System No. 5270 standing on the railway track at said Dopp's spur, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and which are unmarked, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in and about cutting, hauling and preparing said timbers, lumber and railroad ties for market, as a buckler in the woods; that the names of the owners or reputed owners of said timber products are W.T.Noel, J.P.Noel, W.R.Bailey and Hill Lumber Company, a corporation; that J.P.Noel for and on behalf of said owners employed the said Bud Adams to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit: the said owners employed this claimant as such buckler to assist in getting out, cutting, hauling and obtaining said timber products for market at the agreed wage of \$4.50 per day; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said claimant, who performed such labor and rendered such assistance from the period of October 22, 1917, to November 10, 1917 inclusive, and the rendition of such service was closed on the 10th day of November, 1917, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for such services is \$56.40; that no part of said claim has been paid and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon the sum of \$56.40, after deducting all just credits and offsets, in which amount he claims a lien upon the timber products above described, The said claimant also claims a line upon all lumber, ties, timber and timber products now owned by the said owners in said county to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said ties, timber, lumber or timber products.
