Notice of Location.

Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned citizens of the United States having complied with all the requirements of Chapter Six (6) of Title thirty-two (32) of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules and regulations of the United States and the State of Washington, has located a gold and silver bearing quartz lode known as the "Golden Crown," situated in Skamania County, Washington, described as follows. (On the East Bank of Canyon Creek, and about one half ($\frac{1}{4}$) mile below what is known as the Dole Crossing and joins the Ducky Shoke on the East and about three (3) miles above the mouth of Canyon Creek:—beginning at a post on center of said Lode or ledge, and running north three hundred feet (300) to corner post, thence East fifteen hundred feet (1500) to a tree, thence South to center stake three hundred (300) feet, thence South three hundred feet (300) to corner post, thence West fifteen hundred feet (1500) to corner post—thence North three hundred feet (300) to place of beginning.
