NOTICE OF LIEN.

Notice is hereby given that Mrs. C.H. Poppenhagen of Skamania, Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of lumber, ties, timbers located and being upon the platform at Dopp's Spur, about $\frac{3}{4}$ miles East of Skamania Post Office, on the N.P. and S. Railroad, in Skamania County, amounting to approximately 30,000 feet; also a approximately seven hundred thirty nine ties now being and contained in a certain car of the Union Pacific System, No. 25272, standing on the tract at said Dopp's Spur, which were cut in Skamania County, State of Washington, and which are unmarked, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in and about cutting, hauling and preparing said lumber, timber and ties, for market, as a cook; that the names of the owners or reputed owners are W.T. Noel, J.P. Noel and W.R. Bailey, doing business under the firm name and style of Noel-Bailey Lumber Company, and Hill Lumber Company, a corporation; that J.P. Noel, for and on behalf of the above named owners employed said Mrs. C.H. Poppenhagen, to perform such labor and to render such assistance; upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit: The said owners agreed to pay the said Mrs. C.H. Poppenhagen, for such labor and assistance; that said that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with, on the part of said Mrs. C.H. Poppenhagen who rendered such assistance for the period of October and November, 1917, and the rendition of such service was closed on the 10th day of November, 1917, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$71.50 that no part of said claim has been paid, and that there is now due and unpaid and remaining due thereon the sum of \$71.50 after deducting all just credits and offsets, which amount she claims as a lien upon said lumber, timber and ties. The said Mrs. C.H. Poppenhagen also claims a lien on all said lumber, timber and ties now owned by the said W.T. Noel, J.P. Noel and W.R. Bailey, doing business under the firm name and style of Noel-Bailey Lumber Company and the Hill Lumber Company a corporation in said county to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said logs, ties or other timber and lumber herein described.
