NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN A.B.Butterfield, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a quantity of four foot and sixteen inch fir cord wood, being about 130 cords in quantity, which was cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, is unmarked, and is now lying on the ^{Charles} Cliven land about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile westward from the town of Stevenson in said county, such tract of land containing about 33 acres in Sec. 2 Tp 2 N R E W M, and piled on the railroad tract of the S.P.&S. Railway about 150 yards eastward from the depot at Stevenson in said County, for labor performed and assistance rendered in and about cutting, splitting and preparing said cordwood for market, that the name of the owner, or reputed owner, is F.H.Haggood and Smythe & Longeran; that F.H.Haggood employed the said A.B.Butterfield to perform such labor and render such assistance on the following terms and conditions, to-wit: The said F.H.Haggood agreed to pay the said A.B.Butterfield the sum of 85 cents per cord for splitting said wood and \$3.50 per day at other service on said wood; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said S.B.Butterfield who rendered assistance in and about preparing said wood for market for the period between the 21st day of October, 1917, and the 28th day of November, 1917, and the rendition of said services closed on the 27th day of November, 1917, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the ^{said} amount of claimants demand for services is \$129.15, that no part thereof has been paid and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon the sum of \$129.15 in which amount he claims a lien upon said cordwood. That said A.B.Butterfield also claims a lien upon all the wood of said owners in said county to secure payment for the labor in securing said cordwood.
