

"A. H. Stillman" Mining Claim, Bald Mountain District.

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 17 day of June 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 17 day of June 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the "A. H. Stillman" Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This Claim located on Blue Bird creek at the foot of the falls about 10 ft high Also at a Tunnel length of said Tunnel about 18 ft and a fall of about one hundred feet of water Located about eight Rods South E. of discovery. Commencing at Tunnel Running in a Westerly direction 300 ft Thence in Southerly direction 700 ft Thence in an Easterly direction 600 ft Thence in an Northerly direction 700 ft Thence at place of beginning running 300 ft in an Easterly direction Thence in an Northerly direction 700 ft Thence in an Westerly direction 600 ft Thence in a Southerly direction 700 ft. More Particularly described as follows viz, lying on the East side of claim known as the Panama and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
