

"Bernice O' Mining Claim, Bald Mountain District.

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 15 day of June 1899, discovered a vein or lode of quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, silver and lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 15th day of June 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Bernice O' Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet N and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Commences at discovery at a falls about 15 ft on Blue Bird Creek and also at a Tunnel 20 ft in. Commence at discovery post No. one. Running 900 ft northeasterly to corner post No. 2. Thence south-easterly 1500 ft to corner post No. 3. Thence 300 ft south-westerly to centre end post No. 4. Thence 300 ft in the same direction to corner post No. 5. Thence 1000 ft north-westerly to corner post No. 6. Thence 300 ft north-easterly to place of beginning. It borders the Pacific and Wonder to the North East and that claim extend its hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
