

"John Bull" Mining Claim, Bald Mountain District.

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty one years, on the Sixteenth day of June 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this Sixteenth day of June 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Okanogan and State of Washington and known as the John Bull Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the center of the South end of Okye Mining Claim at center post on the Bluebird Trail. Running 300 feet to c/o 2 Post Then 1500 feet in a South Easterly direction to corner Post c/o 3 Then 300 feet West to center end Post c/o 4. Then 300 West to corner Post c/o 5. Then 1500 feet in an Northwesterly direction to corner Post c/o 6. Then 300 feet East to Post at place of Beginning.

and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
