NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That ALBERT COOLEY, of Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington, claims a lien on the franchise, earnings, and on all the real and personal property cwned by and used in the operation of the mill of the Mt. Hood Lumber Company, J. D. Weist, John Doe Vanderberg, and L. C. Stone, particularly located and described as follows:

On sawmill and all the equipment, tools, lumber trucks, machinery, belts, pulleys, and buildings and on all the lumber around and about said mill belonging to the said Mt Hood Lumber Company, J. L. Weist, L. C. Stone and John Doe vanderberg, said mill being located on leased land in the southeast quarter of Section 23, Township. North Range 6 East, Willamette Meridian; also on one certain lot of lumber, consisting of about 1000 railroad ties, about 15,000 feet of scantling, about 30,000 feet of mixed lumber, and a lumber dock, situated in the southwest quarter of Section 24, Township 2 North Range 6 East of the Willamette Meridian. Also on one certain steam logging donkey expine, together with the lines, chokers, hooks, blocks, and all other logging equipment and apparatus belonging thereto and situated on and about the above described premises And also on one and one-half miles of flume situated on the aforesaid described premises And also on one gasoline dragsaw and equipment situated on the aforesaid described premises.

The names of the owners or reputed owners of the above described property is the Mt. Hood Lumber Company, L. C. Stone, J. L. Weist and John Doe Vanderberg, whose principal place of business is Skamania, Skamania County, Washington, and that this claimant was employed by said Mt. Hood Lumber Company and L. C. Stone and J. L. WEist and John Doe Vanderberg at the request of J. L. Weist, agent for the aforesaid parties, upon the following terms and conditions:

The said Mt Hood Lumber Company, J. L. Weist, L. C. Stone and John Doe Vanderberg agreed to pay this claimant Albert Cooley the sum of \$5.50 per day for 8½ days, and 65 cents per hor for 86 hours, for his services as laborer, more particularly described as hired to assist in the handling of logs and the manufacture of lumber.

The said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Albert Cooley, who performed labor upon and assisted in the handling and securing of logs and the manufacture of lumber and about the aforesaid parties' mill for 8½ days while working at the rate of \$5.50 per day, and for 86 hours while working at the rate of 65 cems per hour. That said labor and assistance and services were performed and rendered upon said logs and lumber between the 10th day of My.1918, and the 17th day of July, 1918, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 17th day of July, 1916m and the amount of claimant's demand for said services is \$102.65. That no part thereof has been paid and that there is now due and unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits, the sum of \$102.65, it which amount this claimant claims a lien on all of the above and foregoing described real and personal property or any interest the Mt. Hood Lumber Company, J. L. Weist, L. C. Stone, or John Doe Vanderberg may have in said rel and personal property, to secure payment for work and labor and services performed as herein described, Said work and labor having been performed within 90 days last past.
