

"Wild Boy" Claim. Bald Mountain Mining District.

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of August 1883, discovered a vein or lode of quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim heretofore located, and have this 10<sup>th</sup> day of June 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, re-located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Town 3<sup>rd</sup> east Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Wild Boy Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

Commencing on the Town line between 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> run west (1500) fifteen hundred feet to a stake with a line marked on three sides Thence south (60°) six hundred feet to a stake with wood Thence east (1500) fifteen hundred feet to a stake and around Thence north (60°) six hundred feet to place of commencing.

The above is a Relocation and is Recorded in Book D. on Page 1 records of Deeds

and that I will hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws and the customs and rules of miners, and mining districts and laws of the United States.
