NOTICE OF LIEN.

FIR LUMBER MANUFACTURING COMPANY,

Cascade, Washington.

Notice is hereby given that we, J.J.Amo, J.M.Glenn and George Mercherts, of the city of Portland, Multnomah County, State of Oregon, claim a lien upon the lumber, logs and plant, said lumber being about 500,000 feet board measure in quantity, which were cut and manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, and are now lying in or stacked upon the yards of the Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company at its plant and yards at Cascade, Washington, for labor formed upon and assistance rendered in the cutting of the timber and manufacturing of said lumber.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, and said corporation, if the same is a corporation, is claimed to be owned or controlled by one Karaloge of Portland, Oregon, and two men by the name of Eccles, of Baker City, Oregon.

above: That said reputed Fir Lumber Company, or the above company doing business under the name, employed said J.J.Amo, J.M.Glenn, and George Mercherts in the capacity of hook tender, locomotive Engineer, foreman, camp cook and chaser, respectively.

That during the month of June, 1918, the said J.J.Amo was employed as hook tender and locomotive engineer at a salary as hook tender of 75¢ per hour for a period of eight hours per day, and at \$7.50 per day as hood tender, and that the said J.J.Amo performed and rendered such services to said Company in the capacity of Locomotive engineer and hook tender between the 31st day of May and the 30th day of June, 1918, and that there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon for services, after deducting all just credits and off-sets for the month of June, the sum of \$81.40. That between the 1st day of July, 1918 and the 23rd day of July, 1918, the said J.J.Amo was employed by said Company as foreman at a salary of \$1.00 per hour of eight hours a day, and that the rendition of said service was closed on the 23rd day of July, 1918, and that the amount of the demand of said J.J.Amo for said services up to the 23rd day of July, 1918, is the sum of \$99.30. That no part thereof has been paid and that there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and off-sets, the sum of \$99.30.

That the said J.M.Glenn rendered services as a camp cook at the request of said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company for a period of thirteen days. That said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered as said cook between the 10th day of July, up to and including the 23rd day of July, 1918, and that that amount of his claim and demand for said services is \$37.50, after deducting all just credits and off-sets.

That the said George Mercherts rendered services as a chaser at the request of said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company for a period of nine days at a salary of 65¢ per hour for a period of eight hours per day, and that the said George Mercherts performed and rendered such services to said Company in the capacity of chaser between the 12th and the 23rd day of July, 1918, and that there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon for said services after deducting all just credits and off-sets, the sum of \$28.75.

That thirty days have not elapsed since the claimants were discharged by said Company, and that the said J.J.Amo, J.M.Glenn and George Mercherts claim liens on all or said lumber or logs now owned by the said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, in said Skamania County, to secure payment for the work and labor performed in procuring logs and manufacturing said lumber herein described.
