This Indenture Made this 27th day of July A.D. 1889 between Robert W. Rablge of Portland Oregon Party of the first part and Will S. Crew of Portland Oregon hereafter known as the party of the second part:
 Witnesseth That the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and forty dollar United States Gold Coin, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has bargained and sold and does hereby convey unto the party of the second part, the following described real property, situated in the County of Multnomah Washington Territory, to wit: Lots 3 and 4 and the south half of the North West quarter of Section 22 (2) Township 22 (2) North Range 16 (6) East of the Willamette Meridian 161 $\frac{2}{100}$ acres bought by R. W. Rablge from the United States as shown by Final Receipt No. 3300 from the Receiver of the General Land Office at Vancouver W. D. To have and to hold the said premises and appurtenances to the party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever. And the party of the first part covenants that he is the owner in fee of said premises, and will warrant and defend them against the lawful claims of all persons. Nevertheless, this conveyance is intended to be a Mortgage upon the premises described, to secure the payment of one certain promissory note of which the following is substantially a copy to wit: \$540.00
