

Lafe Williams vs. Fir Lumber Mfg. Company

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That on the 15th day of July, 1918, Lafe Williams, at the request of Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a Corporation, commenced to perform labor as a carpenter upon two certain dwelling houses, to-wit, bungalows, located on State Road No. 8 near Wacomac Post Office on the land in Skamania County, State of Washington described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 1432 feet South and 2322 feet East of the Section corner of Sections 16, 17, 20 and 21, Township 2 North of Range 7 East of the Willamette Meridian; Said point being 40 feet from the S.P. & S. Right-of-Way, and also at County Road, and marked by a 3/4 inch iron pipe, or stake, and running North 47 degrees and 10' West 1022 feet; to a point on State Road No. 8 and marked by a 1/2 inch rod; thence South 66 degrees West 635 feet; thence North 45 degrees West 355 feet; thence South 44 degrees 50' West 40 ft.; thence South 40 degrees 15' East 1190 feet, thence South 45 degrees 25' East 308 feet; thence in an Easterly direction on a line 40 feet from S.P. & S. Right-of-Way to place of beginning, containing 16.3 acres.

of which property the owner, or reputed owner, is the said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a Corporation, the performance of which labor ceased on the 16th day of September, 1918; that said labor performed was in pursuance of a contract with the said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a Corporation, for the payment of the sum of \$5.50 per day of eight hours for said services and was of the value of \$281.38 for which labor the undersigned claims a lien in said sum or \$281.38 less the sum of \$39.40, credit due said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a Corporation, thereon for board and hospital dues, making a total net claim under said lien upon the property herein described, for the sum of \$241.98.

NOTICE OF
CLAIM

Notice is hereby given that Paul Rainey of Clarke County, Washington, claims a lien upon the franchises, earnings and upon the real and personal property of the Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a corporation, the owner above named, which franchise, earnings, real and personal property was and is used in the operation of a saw-mill of the said owner, to the full extent of all moneys due him from said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a corporation, for labor performed by him within six months next preceeding the filing of this claim therefor as follows:-

The demand which is made by the said Paul Rainey from said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Co., a corporation, owner, is for the sum of Eighty-seven Dollars and twenty cents (\$87.20), after deducting all just credits and offsets.

The name of the person employing this claimant is H. F. Kavelage who was and is the President of the said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a corporation, who in so employing the claimant acted for and on behalf of the said Fir Lumber Company.

The terms and conditions of the said employment were that the said Paul Rainey was to perform work, labor and services for the above named owner in the operation of their saw mill situated at Wacomac in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, as a Teamster, at the compensation of One Hundred and Ten Dollars and no cents (\$110.00) per month.

That claimant began work as aforesaid on the 1st day of July, 1918 and the date of the cessation of his said services was July 31st, 1918.

That the agreed wages for said services was the sum of One Hundred and ten Dollars per month but that claimant received goods from the commissary maintained by said Fir Lumber Company to the value of Twenty-two Dollars and eighty cents (\$22.80) which sum has been deducted by claimant from the amount so claimed to be due to him.

That said sum so claimed is for the work done between the first and 31st days of July, 1918 both inclusive, less the amount drawn from commissary.

The property against which this lien is filed and the franchise and earnings thereof and all the real and personal property of said owner upon which this claimant claims a lien and upon which this lien is filed for security for the wages so earned as above set forth, is the saw-mill of said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company located at Cascades, (Wacomac Post Office)
