

"Comstock" Claim, Bald Mountain Mining District.

Notice of Location of Lumpy Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 1 day of Jan 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Lumpy or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby re-located, and have this 14 day of July 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width, on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and Washington of — and known as the Comstock Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the Little Comstock falls and coping with the N.E. corner of Section (32) T-3 R-5 Bash 48 - Rods 13 links distance (North 35° East) Thence North 300 feet to Stake and tree marked on three sides Thence West 1500 feet to Stake and mound Thence South 600 feet to Stake with tree marked on 2 sides Thence Easterly 1500 feet to tree marked on 3 sides Thence North 300 feet to place of beginning Taking all dips and spurs and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
