That said Mt. Hood Lumber Company, J. L. Weist, L. C. Stone and John Doe Vanderberg agreed to pay this Claimant, Elmer Pagh, the sum of .35 per hour for 47½ hours, for his services as laborer, more particularly described as hired for whistle-bby, signalling donkey in hauling logs to the mill, in the manufacture of lumber.

The said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Elmer Pagh, who performed labor upon and assisted in the handling of logs and the manufacture of lumber in and about the aforesaid party's mill, for 47½ hours, at the rate of .35 per hour. That said labor and assistance and services were performed and rendered upon said lumber between the 26th day of June, 1918, and the 2nd day of July, 1918, and the rendition of said services was closed on the 2nd day of July, 1918; and the amount of claimant's demand for services is \$16.63. That no part thereof has been paid, and that there is now due and unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits, the sum of \$16.63, in which amount this claimant claims a lien on all of the above and foregoing described real and personal or any interest the Mt. Hood Lumber Company, J.L. Weist, L. C. Stone, or John Doe Vanderberg may have in said real and personal property, to secure payment for work and labor and services performed as herein described. Said work and labor having been performed within 90 days last past.
