

Benjamin Harrison Claim. Washougal River.

Know all men by these presents, that I the undersigned, have this 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1899, claimed by right of discovery and location 1500 feet linear and horizontal measurement in length, and 600 feet width on the Morton Lode along the Head Course or Divide thereof, 900 feet of said claim, lying and being on the East Slope of the Mountain and West of the Discovery shaft of the Morton Claim, with all dips, spurs, variations and angles, said claim being more particularly described as follows:

Situated on the East slope of the Mountain Ridge lying West of the East Fork of the North Fork of the Washougal River above the quartz claim of L. L. Higgins, known as the Sea Lion claim, and parallel thereto; and being a Westerly Extension of the Morton Claim belonging to the said L. L. Higgins, and extending West from the West end of said Morton Claim 900 feet to the summit of the divide between the East and West Forks of the North Fork of the Washougal River, and thence West 600 feet on the West slope of the mountain -

The name of this claim is the Benjamin Harrison - boundaries marked by posts planted at the corners and in center side points.
