 Ye, That the United States of America, in consid-
 -eration of the premises, and in conformity with
 the several Acts of Congress in such case made and
 provided, have given and granted, and by these
 presents do give and grant, unto the said Albert
 Caine, and to his heirs, the said Tract above des-
 -cribed, To have and to hold the same, together with
 all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurte-
 -nances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the
 the said Albert Caine, and to his heirs & assigns,
 forever: subject to any vested and accrued rights
 for water for mining, agricultural, manufacturing,
 or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs
 used in connection with such water rights, as may
 be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs,
 laws, and decisions of Courts, and also subject to
 the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract
 and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be
 found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby
 granted, as provided by law.
