

Re-location of "Omnia Vincit Labor" claim, Bald Mountain District

Notice of Location of Lumpy claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 24th day of May 1883, discovered a vein or lode of Lumpy or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby re-located, and have this 3rd day of July 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Omnia Vincit Labor Mining claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

On Look too Lode, commencing on the South $\frac{1}{4}$ line of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5 T. 2. R. 15. E. about sixty rods South of the North corner Post of Section 5. T. 2. S. E. East Run West 1500 feet to stake with snow. Thence North 600 feet to stake Thence East 1500 feet to $\frac{1}{4}$ line sixty Rods South of the North corner of Sec. 5 T. 2. S. E.
