The name of the person employing this claimant is H. F. Kavelage who was and is the president of said Fir Lumber Manufacturing Company, a corporation, who is so employing claimant acted for and in behalf of said corporation.

The terms and conditions of said employment were that said Luis Gomez was to perform work, labor and services for the above named owner in the operation of their saw mill situated at Wacomac in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, as a "Bull Cook" so called, at the compensation of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per month.
