

Victoria Claim No. 7 St. Helens Mining District

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 14th day of July 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 14th day of July 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the St. Helens Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the "Victoria Claim No. 7" Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at discovery and running thence 1500 linear feet in a northwest direction and 300 feet on each side of center of said lode or vein.

The discovery is situated on a small creek running in to Lake Creek and is known as Poverty Gulch, about 1500 feet south of the mouth of Jumbo Creek and about 500 feet Southeast of the Jumbo Mine, on the storm side of the Lewis Range.
