NOTICE OF LIEN.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that J. M. Harris of Onenewith, Washington, claims a lien upon the franchise, earnings, and all of the real and personal property of the owners above named, to-wit: the said H. S. Howe and Ben Sweet doing business under the firm name and style of H. S. Lumber Company, which franchise, earnings, real and personal property was and is used in the operation of the saw mill of said owners, to the full extent of all moneys due him from said owners for labor performed within six months next preceding the filing of this claim therefor, as follows:

The demand which is made by the said J.M.Harris from said owners is for the sum of \$74.88, after deducting all just credits and offsets. The name of the person employing said J.M. Harris and who acted for and on behalf of said owners is H. S. Howe, and the terms and conditions of said employment were that the claimant J.M.Harris was to perform work, labor and services for the above named company and owners in the operation of their saw mill situated at Willard in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, as an off-bearer and lumber piled that claimant began the work aforesaid on the 10th day of October, 1918 for said owners and the day of the cessation of his said services was the 12th day of November, 1918; that the agreed wage of said claimant for said work was \$3.50 per day for an eight hour day; that said claim is made for said sum of money for work done during the months of October and November, 1918, between said dates.

The property upon which this lien is filed and the franchise and earnings thereof and all due real and personal property of said owners upon which this lien is filed is situated in Skamania County, Washington, and this claim is filed for security for the work above referred to and intended to cover the saw mill known as the H. S. Lumber Company mill, situated at Willard in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, the machinery, tools and appurtenances therein or adjoining and used in connection therewith together with all lumber, timber, and ties located as said mill, at along the S.P. & S railway right of way at Cooks Station, and along the county road between said mill and said station and on all earnings and on all of the other real and personal property of said owners which was used in the operation of said mill and business during the period of the employment of said claimant for which claim is hereby filed to the extent of said sum of \$74.88, which is due him from said owners.
