

"Saddle Claim. Bald Mountain Mining District

Notice of Location of Quartz Claim.

Notice is hereby given, that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of ~~21~~ twenty-one years, on the 26th day of July 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver, and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 26th day of July 1899 under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, Three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Saddle Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet back from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Situated on the Saddle Lode, on the South half of Section 21, Township 3 North, Range 5 East of the Willamette Meridian, commencing at the East end line of the Henry Claim, and running thence 1500 feet in a South easterly direction, parallel with, and adjacent to the North side line of the Mountain View Lode.

and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States.
