Certificate United States to Mary E. Way.

No. 3478 The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:

Whereas, Mary E. Way, of Multnomah County, Oregon has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Mary E. Way according to the provisions of the Act of Congress, of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands"; and the acts supplemental thereto, for the lots numbered One and two, and the East half of the North West quarter of Section Thirty, in Township Three North of Range Six East of Willamette Meridian, in Washington Territory. Containing one hundred and fifty-two acres and twenty-three hundredths of an acre, according to the official Plat of the survey of said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Mary E. Way.
