Is hereby given that the undersigned a citizen of the United States over the age of twenty-one years on the 19th day of July 1887 discovered a vein or lode of quartz placer mine in place bearing Gold Silver and Lead within the limits of the ~~mined~~ claim hereby located and have this 19th day of July 1887 under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length with surface ground three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode situated in the Texas Sulphur Mining district County of Kamania and Territory of Washington and known as the Lucky Boys Mining claim and extending fifteen hundred feet from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to wit: Beginning at the prospect shaft hole or shaft running 1500 feet to and from this notice and monument (205) thence (300) feet in a northerly direction thence 1500 feet to the North East corner and monument thence 800 feet to center monument thence 800 feet to (S) (E) corner of said monument thence 1500 feet to North West corner & monument thence 800 feet in a northerly direction to the place of beginning and further note we claim the water power running through this claim and that we intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws and the customs and rules of miners and mining statutes ^{and} laws of the United States discovered on the ground this the 19th day of July 1887.
