

"Mississippi" claim. Bald Mountain Mining District

Notice of Location of Lemarky Claim

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 18 day of July 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or sand rock in place bearing Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 5 day of August 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of the vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Mississippi Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

This claim located about 400 ft. S.E. of spring 10 ft. North side Bald Mountain Trail also about 1700 ft. E. Easterly from Three Springs on Bald Mt. Trail. Situated on S.H. to of Section 32, T. 3, R. 5, S. 15. M. This claim commencing at Discovery post N.W. corner end of claim jumbo, thence running 1500 ft. in N. Easterly direction to corner end post also 300 ft each side of center.
