

Alice Mining Claim. Copper Creek Mining District.

Notice of Location.

To whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given, that J. K. Manning, D.W. Ward,  
J. A. Colfelt and Geo. J. Schrecke,

citizens of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-Two of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1899, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Lode Claim, known as the Alice Lode or Mining Claim, said claim having been discovered the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January 1899, and as claim fifteen hundred linear feet on the lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other areas or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries, ground situated in Copper Creek Mining District County of Skamania State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows: To wit:

Beginning at center of Charles Creek on the north slope of Ball Mountain. It runs 1500 feet in a northerly direction to Copper Creek. Thence 300 feet down center of Copper Creek to the North West corner stake. Thence 1500 feet southerly to the South East corner stake on Charles Creek. Thence 300 feet easterly to center end & notice thence 300 feet easterly to the North East corner stake. Thence 1500 feet northerly direction to the North East corner stake. Thence 300 feet northerly direction to center end stake. The discovery is in tunnel about 75 feet away from surface on Charles Creek. The claim known as the Ellen Wood joins this claim on the West. The St Anthony & part of the Generative claims along the East side.

And we intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
