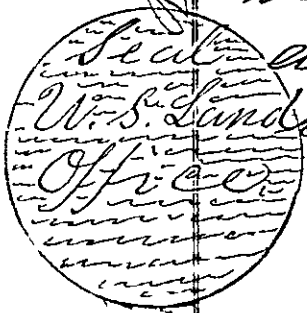


One hundred and sixty acres according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands. returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Mary A. Allan. Know now Ye. That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Mary A. Allan, and to her heirs, the said Tract of above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Mary A. Allan and to her heirs and assigns forever: subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local Customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be so sealed Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
