 of ten (\$10) dollars to us in hand paid
 by Richard N. Shepard, William F. Shep-
 ard and James Shepard, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, have
 bargained and sold, and by these pres-
 ents do bargain and sell, and quit-
 claim unto the said Richard N. Shep-
 ard, William F. Shepard and James
 Shepard, and to their heirs and assigns
 forever, all our right, title, and interest
 estate and claim and demand, both
 at law and in equity, and as well in
 possession as in expectancy, of, in and
 to all that certain piece or parcel of
 land, situate in Skamania County and
 State of Washington, Notification No. (848)
 Right in hundred and Forty-eight,
 Claim No. Forty-three (43) being parts
 of Sections Thirty-one (31) in Township Three
 (3) North of Range Seven (7) and one half
 ($\frac{1}{2}$) East, Section Thirty six (36) in Town-
 ship Three (3) North of Range seven (7) East,
 Section one (1) in Township two (2) North
 of Range seven (7) East, and Section six
 (6) in Township Two (2) North of Range (7)
 seven and one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) East, according
 to the official plat of Survey, returned
 to the General Land Office by the
 Surveyor General, being bounded and
 described as follows, to wit:
