

"Larch" claim, Bald Mountain Mining District.

Certificate of Location of Quartz Mining Claim.

I, Jonathan Bourne, Jr., a citizen of the United States, hereby certify that on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 1899, I discovered within the limits of the claim hereinafter described a lode of rock in place bearing gold, silver, copper and other valuable minerals; that thereafter, and prior to recording this certificate, I located said claim in the following manner: On the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September 1899, I posted at the point of discovery a plain notice, of which the following is a copy, to wit:

Notice of Location

"Notice is hereby given that I, Jonathan Bourne, Jr., a citizen of the United States, have discovered a lode of rock in place carrying gold, silver, copper and other valuable deposits, upon which, at the point of discovery, I have posted this notice.

In accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, I hereby claim fifteen hundred feet of said vein and lode, measured thereon as hereinafter set forth. The general course of this lode is South 49° 55' East. I claim in length thereon fifteen-hundred feet southeasterly from the point of discovery at which this notice is posted. I also claim thirty-two and 1/2 feet on each side of the center of said lode.

Said lode is situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District in the County of Skamania, State of Washington. It shall be known as the Narrow Gauge lode, and this claim shall be known as the Larch lode etc. Said discovery was made September 26<sup>th</sup> 1899.

In accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, I claim ninety days from date of such discovery to enable me to mark the surface boundaries of the claim, and to otherwise perfect and record the location of said claim.

On the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September 1899, I marked the surface boundaries of said claim by placing substantia! stakes bearing the name of the lode and of the claim, and date of location at each corner of said claim, said stakes being not less than three feet high and two inches in diameter, and cut the trees and brush and hewed the lines along the lines

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of said claim to vindicate the location of such lines.

The general course of said lode is South  $69^{\circ} 00'$  East, & claim fifteen hundred linear feet on said lode, to wit: fifteen hundred feet in length Southeastly from point of discovery, and in width thirty-six and  $\frac{1}{2}$  feet on each side of the center of said lode, and all mineral deposit contained within the surface boundaries of said claim, as hereinafter described.

Said claim is and shall be known as the Larch Lode claim. Said claim is situated on the Bald Mountain Mining District, in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and as marked on the ground the surface boundary of said claim is particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a post in a mound of rock at the Southwest corner of said claim (being also the Southeast corner of the Alder claim) said post being  $420\frac{1}{2}$  feet North and  $543\frac{1}{2}$  feet West of the quarter section corner on the North side of Section 28 in Township 3 North of Range 3 East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence South  $69^{\circ} 00'$  East fifteen hundred (1500) feet; thence North  $32^{\circ}$  East sixty-four and seven-tenths ( $64\frac{7}{10}$ ) feet, thence North  $69^{\circ} 00'$  East fifteen hundred (1500) feet; thence South  $32^{\circ}$  West sixty-four and seven-tenths ( $64\frac{7}{10}$ ) feet to the place of beginning.

And I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
