

Amended Location of "Omnia Bona Bonis" Claim, Bald Mountain District

Notice of Amended Location of Quartz Mining Claim.

Notice is hereby given that J. H. A. Howe, a citizen of the United States, having complied with the requirements of the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, and the local customs, laws and regulations, have located, and claim by virtue of the original discovery and location and this amended certificate of location, fifteen hundred linear feet on this the 400 400 lode of mineral bearing quartz, and three hundred feet in width on the southerly side of the center of said lode, and eighty-five feet in width on the northerly side of the center of said lode, together with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto. This claim is situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and is and shall be known as the Omnia Bona Bonis Mining Claim.

The general course of said lode is South $61^{\circ} 55'$ East, and I claim in length on said lode fifteen hundred feet southeasterly from the point of discovery, at which point I have posted an original duplicate of this notice. I have marked the surface boundaries of this claim by placing substantial posts not less than three feet high and four inches in diameter at each corner of said claim, bearing the name of the lode and of the claim and the date of location, and have cut the brush and marked and blazed the trees along the lines of said claim to indicate the location of said lode.

The surface boundary of this claim is particularly described as follows to-wit:

Beginning at a post in a mound of rock at the southwest corner of said claim (being also the southeast corner of the Little Bell claim.) said post being 1422 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet North and 1046 East of the Northwest corner of Section 28 in Township 3, North of Range 8 East of the Willamette Meridian and running thence South $69^{\circ} 50'$ East, fifteen hundred feet; thence North 32° East three hundred and eighty-five (385) feet; thence North 69° East fifteen hundred (1500) feet; thence South 32° West, three hundred and eighty-five (385) feet to place of beginning.

And I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the laws of the United States and of

the State of Washington.

This is an amended location of the *Omnia Bona Bonis* claim discovered by H. J., E. E. H. Herbert C. and Marquis Lawton on the 24th day of July 1896, and located on the 15th day of August 1896, and recorded at page 160 of Book "B" of Miscellaneous Records of Skamania County, Washington, I now being the owner of said claim by purchase and conveyance from said original locator.

This amended certificate of location is made without waiver of any right previously acquired by me by virtue of said original location, purchase and conveyance, and for the purpose of correcting any errors in the original location, description or record of said claim, and of taking in any additional ground which is subject to location, and any part of any overlapping claim which has been abandoned.

This amended certificate dated this 28th day of September 1899.
