

"Dry Top" Claim. Bald Mountain Mining District.

Notice of Amended Location of Quartz Mining Claim.

Notice is hereby given that I, W. A. Howe, a citizen of the United States, having complied with the requirements of the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, and the local customs, laws and regulations, have located, and claim by virtue of the original discovery and location and this amended certificate of location, fifteen hundred linear feet on this the Yellow jacket lode of mineral bearing quartz, and three hundred feet in width on the northerly side of the center of said lode and two hundred feet in width on the southerly side of the center of said lode, together with all mineral deposits contained therein, and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto. This claim is situated in the Bald Mountain mining district, in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and is and shall be known as the Dry Top mining claim.

The general course of said lode is South  $59^{\circ} 52'$  East and the claim in length on said lode fifteen hundred feet southeasterly from the point of discovery, at which point I have posted an original duplicate of this notice.

I have marked the surface boundaries of this claim by placing substantial posts not less than three feet high and four inches in diameter at each corner of said claim, bearing the name of the lode and of the claim and the date of location, and have cut the brush and marked and blazed the trees along the lines of said claim to indicate the location of said lines.

The surface boundary of this claim is particularly described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a post in a mound of rock at the southwesterly corner of said claim (being also the southwesterly corner of the Bald Mountain claim) said post being 2255 feet north and 1344 feet west of the northwesterly corner of section 28 in Township 32 North of Range 5 East of the Willamette meridian, and running thence south  $59^{\circ} 52'$  East, fifteen hundred (1500) feet; thence north  $52^{\circ}$  East five hundred (500) feet; thence north  $59^{\circ} 52'$  East fifteen hundred (1500) feet; thence south  $32^{\circ}$  East five hundred (500) feet to place of beginning.

I do claim to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.

This is an amended certificate of location of the "dry top" claim, discovered by Willis W. Lawton on the day of August 1893, and located on the 31st day of August 1893, and recorded at page 147 of Book "A" of Miscellaneous Records of Okanogan County Washington, it now being the owner of said claim by purchase and conveyance from said original locator.

This amended certificate of location is made without waiver of any rights previously acquired by me by virtue of said original location, purchase and conveyance, and for the purpose of correcting any errors in the original location, description or record of said claim, and of taking in any additional ground which is subject to location, and any part of any overlapping claim which has been abandoned.

This amended certificate dated this 28<sup>th</sup> day of September 1899.
