NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT DORSEY WALTON OF SKAMANIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON CLAIMS A LIEN UPON A QUANTITY OF LUMBER NOW AT THE MILL OF THE CARSON MILL AND FLUME COMPANY NEAR CARSON, AND AT THE DOCK OR PLATFORM OWNED BY OR USED BY SAID OWNERS AT THE S. P. & S. RY. STATION AT CARSON STATION, IN SAID COUNTY OF SKAMANIA, BEING ABOUT EIGHT THOUSAND FEET AT THE SAID MILL, AND ABOUT TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND FEET AT THE SAID DOCK; ALSO ABOUT 500 RAILROAD TIES PILED AT THE DOCK BELONGING TO CARSON LUMBER COMPANY AT THE SAID CARSON STATION; ALSO APPROXIMATELY 100M LOGS IN WOODS AT SAID MILL FOR LABOR PERFORMED UPON AND ASSISTANCE RENDERED IN THE MANUFACTURE OF SAID LUMBER, TIES AND LOGS; THAT THE NAMES OF THE OWNERS OR REPUTED OWNERS ARE CARSON MILL AND FLUME COMPANY, C.
