

U.S. To E. L. Hardy and wife

The United States of America

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting;
 Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office
 of the United States a certificate numbered one hundred
 and twelve of the Register and Receiver at Vancouver Wash-
 ington Territory whereby it appears that under the
 provisions of the act of Congress approved the 27th day
 of September 1850, entitled an act to create the Office
 of Surveyor General of the Public lands in Oregon and
 to provide for the Survey and to make Donations to
 settlers of the said Public lands; and the legislation
 supplemental thereto, the claim of Ebenezer L. Hardy and
 his wife Mary A. Hardy, of Skamania County Washington
 Territory. Notification No 842 has been established
 to a Donation of one half section or Three hundred
 and twenty acres of land; and that the same has been sur-
 veyed and designated as claim number thirty eight,
 being part of section twenty five in Township two north
 of Range six East and claim number forty one being part
 of section thirty six Township two north of Range seven
 East according to the official Plat of Survey on
 turned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
 General being bounded and described as follows
 to wit: Beginning at a point one chain and twenty-
 seven links west of the north west corner of section
 thirty six Township north of Range seven East, and running
 thence south fifty seven chains and forty links, thence south
 eighty six degrees and forty five minutes East two chains;
 thence north eighty six degrees and thirty minutes East
 seven chains and fifty links; thence north twenty four
 degrees East six chains; thence north sixty two degrees
 and forty five minutes East fourteen chains and fifty links;
 thence north forty eight degrees East two chains; thence
 north sixty three degrees and fifteen minutes East five
 chains; thence north seventy five degrees and forty five
 minutes East two chains and twenty five links; thence
 north seventy degrees and thirty minutes East eleven
 chains and fifty links; thence north sixty one degrees
 and forty five minutes East five chains and fifty links;
 thence north thirty five degrees East two chains;
