

"Ideal" Mining Claim in Copper Creek District
 Notice of Location of Quartz Claim

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, on the 6 day of September 1899, discovered a vein or lode of Quartz or sand rock in place bearing, Gold, Silver and Lead, within the limits of the claim hereby located, and have this 12 day of September 1899, under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States, located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length, with surface ground, three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode, situated in the Copper Creek Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and known as the Ideal Mining Claim, and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows to-wit:

Beginning at S. W. Corner & running 600ft. S.E. to S.E. corner. Thence 1500ft North of N.E. to N.E. corner. Thence 600ft. N.W. to N.W. corner. Thence 1500 South of S.W. to S.W. corner.

The said Ideal Claim is situated at the head of the right fork of Maiden gulch & about 600ft above the falls & about 500 ft above the junction of the two forks. Also an extension on the N.E. end of the Dunshire & Joines the Tenderfoot on the east side and the Home State on the S.W. end, and is in Sec 24 Township 4 North of range 5 East and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws, and the customs and rules of miners, and mining statutes and laws of the United States
