Power To Sell.

Know all men by these presents, that I William Graves, a Steamboat Man, and Hitty Graves his wife, of New Orleans in the Parish of Orleans and State of Louisiana, have made, constituted, and appointed, and by these presents do make, constitute and appoint Julius Ordway, of Portland, Oregon, my true and lawful Attorney for me, and in my name, place and stead, to sell and convey all lands located in my name, as my "Additional Homestead", under the provisions of Section 2306, of the Revised Statutes of the United States, being the following described public lands, to wit: The North Half of the South East quarter of Section Twelve, in Town Two (2) North Range Five (5) East of the Willamette Meridian, in the State of Washington, and for me, in my name or behalf, to enter into and upon the said described premises, and take and hold possession.
