Power of Attorney.

Know all men by these Presents, that I
Daniel W. Long, a widower, of the County of
Seward, State of Nebraska, unmarried, do
hereby make, constitute and appoint Julius
Ordway my true and lawful attorney, hereby
authorizing and empowering my said Attorney
to sell upon such terms as to him shall
seem meet, any lands which I now own, either
in law or equity, and obtained by me as an
"Additional Homestead" under the provisions of
Section 2306 of the Revised Statutes of the
United States, and to sell any such lands
as I may hereafter acquire under said
acts, and to receive the purchase money, or
other consideration therefor, and upon such sale,
to make, sign, seal and deliver in my name
all such deeds, or other assurances in the law
therefor, as to him shall seem meet and nec-
essary, hereby empowering him to fill all
blanks herein. And I further authorize
and empower my said Attorney to receive, accept
and take possession of all lands hereinbefore
mentioned, and to prosecute and defend at
his own cost any suit or action respecting
the same for the breach of any contract in
relation thereto, or for any trespass thereupon
or injury thereto, of any nature or description.
