 To all to whom these Presents shall Come Greeting
 Whereas there has been deposited in the
 General Land Office of the United States
 a Certificate of the Register of the Land
 Office at Vancouver, Washington Territory
 whereby it appears that pursuant to the
 Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862, "To
 secure Homesteads to actual settlers on
 the Public Domain," and the Acts sup-
 plemental thereto, the claim of Daniel
 W. Long has been established and duly
 consummated, in conformity to law, for
 the ^{North} ~~West~~ quarter of Section Fourteen in
 Township Two North of Range Five East
 of Willamette Meridian, in Washington Ter-
 ritory, containing eighty acres, according
 to the official Plat of the Survey of the said
 Land, returned to the General Land Office
 by the Surveyor General;

Know Now Ye, That there is therefore
 granted by the United States unto Daniel
 W. Long, the Tract of Land above described:
 To have and to hold the said Tract of
 Land, with the appurtenances thereof unto
 the said Daniel W. Long, and unto his heirs
 and assigns forever; subject to any vested
 vested and accrued water rights for min-
 ing, agricultural, manufacturing, or other
 purposes, and rights to ditches and res-
 ervoirs used in connection with such water
 rights, as may be recognized and acknow-
 ledged by the local Customs, Laws,
 and decisions of Courts, and also sub-
 ject to the right of the proprietor of a
 vein or lode to extract and remove his
 ore therefrom, should the same be found
 to penetrate or intersect the premises here-
 by granted, as provided by law.
